Dear Alameda Family:

I am writing to tell you about a high school that has been an incredible opportunity for youth in our community. The Bay Area School of Enterprise (BASE) is an exciting public school located on Alameda Point.

BASE is accepting 9th graders for fall 2006. There is also a limited number of other grade openings. We anticipate that there will be many more applicants than there are openings, so act soon!

BASE offers:

- **Small class sizes** with experienced educators and an emphasis on small group and one-on-one instruction. Class size does not exceed 20 students. Extensive **counseling services** and **college and career preparation** support are offered.
- **Frequent parent communication** and conferences in order for parents to know how their child is progressing at all times.
- **Community-based projects** that get students involved in the issues that affect them and excited about what they are learning.
- A **college prep** curriculum that emphasizes reading, writing, and speaking, and includes: **honors courses, graduation requirements aligned with California university eligibility requirements, and UC-approved courses**. 85% of our graduates have gone on to colleges across the country.
- An emphasis on **real world skills** and community involvement that prepares students to be successful in college and the world of work. Students discover their passions, set goals, and work towards making their future a successful one. The program includes **internships, community projects, running small businesses**, and more.
